**Job** Persons in this profession evaluate radon or radon decay products test results to **Description** ensure validity of test; conduct and evaluate diagnostic tests necessary to design effective radon mitigation systems; and, design and install (or supervise the installation of) radon mitigation systems to reduce radon levels to below 4.0 pC/L.

Required

**Education &** Applicants must be at least 18 years of age and have three years of relevant **Experience** professional work experience (post-secondary education in a related field may be substituted on a year-for-year basis for two of the three years of experience). They must successfully complete a one-week radon measurement and radon mitigation course approved by the Iowa Department of Public Health (IDPH).

> Radon mitigation specialists are subject to annual inspection by IDPH. They must comply with a Department-approved worker protection plan and quality assurance/quality control (QA/QC) program.

Continuing

At least six hours of Department of Public Health-approved courses or seminars **Education** on radon mitigation are required annually for recredentialing.

**Examination** Applicants must take and pass the Radon Contractors Proficiency Examination administered by the Iowa Department of Public Health.
