Attendees at the live event will receive six hours of continuing education credit, for what is undoubtedly the liveliest and most enjoyable way we can offer CE credits! For those who can't attend the live event, I'll be video-recording the performers and for those who grant their permission, I'll be posting the videos on YouTube. But please note: in this instance, no credits are awarded for watching these videos..."
