## Severe Weather Awareness Week is March 27-31

The Iowa Department of Homeland Security and Emergency Management (HSEMD) and the National Weather Service (NWS) will again recognize the last week in March (March 27-31), as Severe Weather Awareness Week in Iowa. The goal of Severe Weather Awareness Week is to provide Iowans with a better understanding and to increase awareness of the state's spring weather hazards.

For each day during Severe Weather Awareness Week, a different subject will be featured:

- Monday Severe thunderstorms
- Tuesday Weather warnings
- Wednesday Tornadoes
- Thursday Family preparedness
- Friday Flash floods

The highlight of the week will be the annual tornado drill, which will take place on Wednesday, March 29, at 10 a.m. Schools, businesses, government employees, military, and individuals are encouraged to participate in the drill.

### **April is 911 Education Month**

The lowa Department of Homeland Security and Emergency Management (HSEMD) and the lowa 911 Communications Council will sponsor 911 Education Month in April again this year. This month-long campaign is aimed at lowans of all ages in an effort to educate them on the importance of 911, and the role they play in ensuring effective and efficient emergency response in times of crisis.

It's also important to teach lowans how 911 technology is evolving. Currently, lowa is nearing the completion of an upgrade to lowa's 911 network to an end-to-end Internet Protocol (IP)-based network, which is more robust and capable of handling new messaging technology. Blake DeRouchey, lowa's 911 program manager, said Text-to-911, for example, is becoming increasingly more available in lowa, though not yet available everywhere. "For now, you can check with your local sheriff's office to determine if Text-to-911 is available in your area," he said, but added, "We expect statewide availability of Text-to-911 to occur sometime this summer."

In addition, the State has contracted with a company to provide aerial photography for use in all of lowa's 911 call centers. Data from geographic information systems (GIS) technology is key for call handling, call routing, call delivery, location validation, and emergency response. This information is essential for situational awareness, and when dispatching responders.
