The Travel Guide's partner publication, the *lowa Calendar of Events*, rolls off the press this month. The 2001 installment is the largest ever, containing more than 2,000 events that take place throughout the year. In July, the publication's second edition will be available and will include only events that take place during the last six months of 2001. #### Legislative Day joins Lawmakers, tourism pros

ess than one month after the 2001 legislative session begins, members of the lowa tourism industry will have a unique opportunity to meet with the state's lawmakers. Slated for February 7, the annual Travel Federation of lowa-sponsored Legislative Day includes a legislative briefing



at 9:00 a.m. at the Embassy Suites in Des Moines. At the event, Iowa's legislative leaders will brief attendees on the Legislature's goals for this session. After the briefing and throughout the day, the Iowa Gaming Association

will run a shuttle bus between the Embassy Suites and the state capitol, giving tourism professionals a chance to head to the statehouse to meet one-on-one with their legislators.

That evening, more than 60 exhibitors will make their way to the Tourism Building on the Iowa State Fairgrounds for a legislative showcase. Last year more than 60 percent of the state's lawmakers, as well as Governor and Mrs.Vilsack, attended the event.

While the legislative showcase is open only to exhibitors who are pre-registered and paid, the legislative briefing is open to anyone who would like to learn more about the 2001 legislative session and its potential impact on tourism in lowa. On December 15, Governor Tom Vilsack, Lt. Governor Sally Pederson, Senator Mary Kramer, and Speaker of the House Brent Siegrist joined the Vision Iowa Board at their monthly meeting. At the meeting, the group finalized plans for the upcoming review of applications for funding under both programs. Because the Legislative Rules Review Committee voted to approve the rules at their meeting on December 12, the rules became final on December 20 and the first applications for funding were eligible to be submitted on that date.
