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## General Permit No. 5 Rulemaking: Public Hearing

The National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) wastewater general permit for mining and processing facility discharges, otherwise known as General Permit No. 5 (GP7), will expire on July 19, 2021. The Environmental Protection Commission (EPC) is proposing to renew the permit for a forth five-year term. Proposed changes to the permit include formatting, minor revisions to simplify existing language and improve clarity, additional definitions, and the inclusion of applicable existing state rules. The permit's definition for "Waters of the United States" is also being updated to reference the June 22, 2020, federal definition.

A public hearing on the proposed GP5 will be held via conference call at 2:00 PM on Tuesday, September 2, 2020. ## **General Permit No. 7 Rulemaking: Public Hearing**

The National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) wastewater general permit for pesticide discharges, otherwise known as General Permit No. 7 (GP7), will expire on May 17, 2021. The Environmental Protection Commission (EPC) is proposing

to renew the permit for a third five-year term. Proposed changes to the permit include formatting and other minor revisions to simplify existing language and improve clarity. The permit's definition for "Waters of the United States" is also being updated to reference the June 22, 2020, federal definition.

A public hearing on the proposed GP7 will be held via conference call at 2:00 PM on Tuesday, September 1, 2020. ## 2020 WTFAP Grant Application Now Available

The 2020 Wastewater and Drinking Water Treatment Financial Assistance Program (WTFAP) application is now available.

Grants will be awarded to water and wastewater projects based on the following priorities:

- Disadvantaged communities
- Projects that will significantly improve water quality in their watershed
- Projects that use alternative wastewater treatment technologies (all projects proposing alternative technologies must be approved by DNR)
- Communities with the highest sewer or water rates
- Projects that use technology to address nutrient reduction
- Projects that will improve source waters for drinking water utilities

### 2020 WTFAP Application

Applications are due September 25.

The grant awardees are determined by a committee consisting of the Secretary of Agriculture (or designee), the Executive Director of IFA (or designee) and the Director of DNR (or designee).

# **DNR Drinking Water and Wastewater Treatment Operator Exams**

#### **Remote Proctoring of Certification Exams**

lowa's Drinking Water and Wastewater operators, pre COVID19, took proctored, standardized certification exams either at DMACC Southridge Computer Lab or, by appointment, at one of the Iowa DNR Regional Field Offices. Due to the ambiguity of when, and if, these venues will again be open to the public, Iowa is switching to remote proctoring. In mid September, operators will be able to take Drinking Water or Wastewater certification exams on any computer that has a camera and microphone; anytime, any quiet secluded place.

Once an operator logs in to an exam using the provided link and put in their unique number assigned upon eligibility, their browser is frozen; a proctor from the testing company can see them through the computer camera; their surroundings are monitored for extra materials or cheating; and the test session is recorded for future reference if there are any cheating suspicions or accusations. The testing company will provide a YouTube video and live customer support for any technical issues arising during a remote session.

Post Covid19, our operators will have two options for exam delivery: remote proctoring and our traditional method of on-line at an Iowa DNR Field Office or Community College computer lab.

#### How do operators get signed up for a remotely proctored exam?

IDNR will send out letters; utilize the DNR listserves and post on our website all information relative to an operator's new testing options when we have a more finite start date. Potential examinees should monitor our <a href="OpCert Webpage">OpCert Webpage</a>; all information will be posted here the minute it is finalized.
