-President Abraham Lincoln With the looming funnel date of March 11th, sub-committee meetings are being held at a rapid rate as legislators make every effort to consider bills and get bills of interest or priority through at least one standing committee.

The number of bills currently being considered related to dependent adult abuse clearly indicates this continues to be a top concern. However, with the complexities of the issues involved, the desire by the legislature to focus on developing alternate choices in long-term care and the reality of limited time, dependent adult abuse may be an issue that the legislature decides to focus on next year. During the past two years, the legislature has made a number of changes to strengthen Iowa's dependent adult abuse laws and there continues to be strong support for continuing to review the issue.

Study Bills related to long term care in Iowa and to the concept of a universal assessment have been introduced in the senate. These bills are SSB 1201 and SSB 1210. Also of interest as a study bill is SSB 1204, the Medicare Task Force. This proposed bill directs the Department of Human Services (DHS) to convene a task force implementing the Medicare drug benefit created under the Medicare Prescription Drug Improvement and Modernization Act of 2003. The bill assigns four legislators, two older Iowans, and the directors of DHS, Department of Public Health (DPH) and Department of Elder Affairs (DEA) as members of the task force.

The concept of mental health parity continues to move forward (many advocates tell me the proposal has been a topic of concern since 1994). To that end, <u>HF 420</u> will move to the full house for debate.

Two pieces of legislation propose the food code will move to the DPH versus its current location within the Iowa Department of Inspections and Appeals (DIA) (<u>SSB 1211</u> and <u>HSB 176</u>). The department is monitoring this bill and is reviewing a number of issues related to the food code that may be able to be addressed during these discussions.

The fun bill introduced this week, by Representative Lukan, was <u>HF 416</u>. This bill creates a special antlerless crossbow season for Iowans who are 70 or older. Having recently had a personal rendezvous with a deer on I-35, I will be taking a personal interest in the progress of this bill.

Monday: The Senate Human Resources Committee discussed the departments proposed language related to the Medical Assistance Advisory Council (SSB 1042). There were no objections to the addition of members,

however, Senator Tinsman did ask that the bill be deferred in order for her to offer an amendment related to the timing of when MAAC members receive proposed budgets. The bill was deferred, but will likely be taken up again early next week.

Tuesday: Rob McCommons, of Integrated Care Strategies Inc., briefed both the House and Senate Human Resources standing committees about the Program of All-inclusive Care for the Elderly (PACE). This presentation can be accessed at the department's website, along with the feasibility study conducted in Iowa in 2004 by the National PACE organization and CMS. The report suggests that PACE is feasible in Iowa. In addition to the demographic areas studied in the PACE document, there is strong support to establish PACE programs in Sioux City and in Mason City. Representatives from Sioux City and Mason City also met with the Governor's Health Policy Advisor.

Wednesday: The department's legislation related to the Medical Assistance Advisory Council (<u>HSB 100</u>), Assisted Living (<u>HSB 95</u>) and adult day services (<u>HSB 102</u>) were discussed amended and passed to the full House Human Resources Standing Committee. Also passed out of the House Ways and Means Committee was <u>HF 26</u>, the Pension Income Phase Out. <u>HF 26</u> will now move to the full house for consideration.

Thursday: The department's technical bill related to the Elder Iowans Act (HSB 157) passed out of the House Human Resources Standing Committee, along with HSB 103, related to the establishment of the Governor's Office on Volunteerism. HSB 103 will move the Retired Senior Volunteer Program from the Department of Elder Affairs to the Governor's Volunteer Commission. A sub-committee meeting was also held related to the Medicaid reimbursement of Assisted Living (HSB 154).

About Next Week:

- The department's proposed language relating to establishing an office of substitute decision making will be discussed in subcommittee at 9:00 a.m. on March 2nd in the Senate Lounge. It is also likely this bill will be scheduled for sub-committee in the house (HSB 96 and HF 120).
- A sub-committee meeting related to Iowa's food code is scheduled for 7:30 a.m. on Tuesday, March 1st, in the house lounge.
- It is likely the department's bill related to elder group homes will be discussed.
- A number of department bills also have the potential to move out of standing committee

■-□-■ ELDER AFFAIRS FEATURE PROGRAM ■-□-■ Elderly Nutrition Program

This program is most noted for the congregate and home delivered meal program. These programs are under the Older Americans Act (OAA), administered by the US Department of Health and Human Services, Administration on Aging (AoA) and coordinated at the state level by the Iowa Department of Elder Affairs (DEA). A nutritious meal and socialization are provided for individuals 60 years of age and older. The meals along with nutrition screening, education and counseling provided by the program are important in keeping older adults as healthy as possible so that they can continue living independently in their own homes and community.

The nutrition programs are multi-funded with public funding (federal, state, local) and private (contributions from older adults, fund-raising, foundations, etc.). Total nutrition program resources for SFY 2004 were \$25,429,399. The federal funding provides 49% of the cost of a congregate meal and 41% of the cost of a home-delivered meal. Federal funding has remained flat for the past several years and has not reflected the increase in program costs. The state of Iowa contribution is negligible (<1%). Financial considerations are leading to limitations in the number of meals available.

To put the program in a context with other programs that serve older adults, the OAA Nutrition Program serves more older adults and provides greater benefits to participating older adults than the Food Stamp Program, CACFP, CSFP, TEFAP, etc. However, vulnerable older adults must cobble together assistance from multiple sources to help ensure adequate food intake, so that every single one of these programs helps meet the various needs of older adults.

The National Pilot Survey found that OAA Nutrition Programs serve very vulnerable older adults, and that despite participation in the programs about 11% of congregate and 25% of home-delivered participants indicated that they did not have enough money or food stamps to buy food. Approximately 83% of the Iowa congregate meal participants at below the 185% poverty level. The Elderly Nutrition Program is reaching the targeted audience. Adequate funding is needed to ensure this continues.
