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Legislative Update

Under the Dome

On Tuesday, January 24th, the department presented information related to Iowa's Case Management Program for Frail Elders (CMPFE) to both the Senate and House Human Resource Standing Committees. The presentation is available under "What's New at DEA" at: www.state.ia.us/elderaffairs/

On Thursday, January 26th, the department presented information related to its overall budget to the Health and Human Services Joint Appropriations Sub-Committee. The presentation is available under "What's New at DEA" at: www.state.ia.us/elderaffairs/

The focus of the presentations overall was the department's request for three million dollars to include ongoing case management a reimbursed service under the Title XIX HCBS Elderly Waiver (Medicaid for those living in community settings). Iowa is the only state in the nation that does not reimburse for ongoing case management services to its elders and one of two states that does not draw down federal matching dollars as well. This means that the three million dollars requested would sustain a program that has a rapidly deteriorating infrastructure.

What is the Case Management Program for Frail Elders?

The CMPFE program has been providing services to Iowans age 60 and older for over 18 years. CMPFE is a program of the Department of Elder Affairs, and is administered at the local level by Iowa's Area Agencies on Aging who partner with provider and service agencies to create a support network that is vital to keeping frail and vulnerable older adults in their existing homes and communities.

CMPFE is a cost containment program. Last year, the program served 13,164 elder Iowans, all of whom qualified for institutionalization, but were able to remain in their own homes and communities through the provision of services delivered to them in their homes. On average, there are 9,463 active clients per month, 75.5% of whom are Medicaid recipients. If these individuals were to be institutionalized, it is projected that an additional 22 million dollars a month would be necessary in Medicaid expenditures.

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What is the Problem?

CMPFE was started as a demonstration program and it was not until 1999 that the program reached all 99 Iowa Counties. The appropriation to the program has never been based on cost, which means the existing system is dependent upon donated time and services as well as limited financial resources. The estimated value of the donated case management time per client per month is estimated at \$34.29. Actual expenditures are \$44.93 per client per month, for a total of \$79.32. Both area agencies on aging and their community partners are no longer able to sustain the cost of donated services.

What Solution has the Governor and the Department of Elder Affairs Proposed?

The DEA has proposed that like 48 of the 50 states, Iowa recognize case management as a reimbursable service under the states Title XIX HCBS Elderly Waiver. The approximate cost would be \$114.00 per client per month, or an increase of \$34.68 per client per month. New state dollars are needed to make the federal match in the amount of 3 million dollars. Governor Vilsack has included this three million dollars in his FY 07 budget. This additional funding would increase the frequency of client contact, concentrate client

contact related to needs and services, enhance the focus on the prevention of existing problems and reduce their escalation and provide for increased operational support. The additional funding would also begin covering the cost of the donated costs and services, thereby creating a sustainable system as reliance on donated costs and services has begun to erode the foundation of the CMPFE program.

LEGISLATORS HAVE A DECISION TO MAKE

Governor Vilsack supports frail and vulnerable seniors remaining in their own homes and communities and maximizing opportunities to draw down federal matching dollars that strengthen Iowa's Aging Network.

The issues are complex, and DEA has boiled this down to the basics:

Legislators have to decide if they want to strengthen an existing program that better meets the needs of older Iowan's and maximizes federal matching dollars or if they want to leave the system as it is, which will mean fewer frail and vulnerable older Iowans will be able to access the services that keep them independent and in their own homes.

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Winning Compliance

The Governor has included in the DEA budget \$62,500 for consumer education related to assisted living, adult day services and elder group homes.

What is it?

Implementation of the "Winning Compliance" strategy will focus resources on providing to consumers information related to adult day programs, assisted living programs and elder group homes. The information provided will be accurate and easily understood by Iowa's elders, their families and other stakeholder in Iowa's longterm care system.

Public policy has been and will continue to evolve regarding Iowa's adult day service, assisted living and elder group home industries. While the concept of shared risk has been utilized for a number of years, it was formalized in 2003 statutory changes. Changes were again made to Iowa's administrative code in 2004 and again to Iowa Code in 2005.

Objectives include:

The experience of the department has been that consumers are often uninformed and confused in a number of areas related to adult day services, assisted living and elder group homes. The objective of this budget offer is to educate elder Iowans, their families and others in:

- 1. Understanding that regulation in HCBS settings places responsibility on both the consumers and providers.
- 2. Understanding and negotiating occupancy/written agreements.
- 3. Understanding managed risk agreements.
- 4. Understanding the application of tenant landlord law and its impact on the tenant.
- 5. Understanding staffing requirements.
- 6. Understanding the scope of services each type of product provides and how each product may fit into a long-term care plan.
- 7. Understanding tenant/participant rights in the event of an involuntary discharge.
- 8. Understanding how to access specific code and administrative rule requirements.
- 9. Understanding which executive branch agencies has responsibility for policy, enforcement, life safety and Medicaid.
- 10. Understanding how to access services.
